In the afternoon of Saturday, 25th April 2015, a massive earthquake measuring 7.9 on the Richter scale struck Nepal, causing massive damages and loss of life. All 75 districts of Nepal with millions of people are affected.



DEVASATATION BEYOND IMAGINATION

This apocalyptic moment turned the lives of Nepali to a chaotic mode. The earthquake has inflicted a never healing scar on the face of Nepal. Thousands have died and millions are left homeless. Ancient monuments of forgotten kings, mythical valleys with ancient intricate alleyways and multihued villages now lie under rubble.

MOST AFFECTED AREAS



The cruelest wounds have been inflicted on our remote villages — those once picturesque and pristine with honest and hardworking people are converted into ruins. That very charm of remoteness has turned these hills into landscapes of misery.

DEATH & DAMAGES



The consequences of the April 25th earthquake are too widespread and too big for Nepal to handle properly. The estimates of the deaths and damages that have come out so far are still preliminary. The actual figures are likely to be substantially higher.

LENDING A HELPING HAND



We survived the disaster that has befallen on us in the wake of the devastating earthquake, but not all Nepalese were that fortunate.

TREKKING EXPERTS moved to the most affected areas to extend rescue and relief to the unfortunate fellow countrymen.

THE CALL

The situation calls for a sustained support to prevent death from hunger and risk of epidemics of communicable diseases in weakened populations.



RESCUE & EVACUATION

Upon confirming of well being of our families, members of Trekking Experts moved immediately for rescue and evacuations to the affected area of Rasuwa. We reached few affected areas to find nothing. Every house in the village is destroyed with bodies scattered all around. We were able to rescue few injured people and pull hundreds on dead bodies.



Due to limited accessibility, we were unable to carry any relief materials or tools other than few medicines. However, to avoid contamination, we created a mass grave for the bodies.





BUILDING TEMPORARY SHELTERS

The survivors were scattered all around without proper food and shelter.

We helped build few temporary shelters with whatever materials we could find.

With a promise of returning soon with relief material, we headed back to Kathmandu
